Thank you to the Fire Department for their response to the house fire last week in the very extreme weather conditions. Our thoughts are with the family who lost their home and belongings. Thanks to Grant Township and Fire District #1 for their help with the structure fire. Thanks to State Farm Insurance Amanda West for providing pizza during the fire event. It is community members like Amanda that make us proud to

be residents of Abilene, Kansas. Thanks to Jennie Hiatt who also provided food once the fire fighters were able to make it back to the fire station to clean up and warm up. Chief Strunk did share that everyone was in good shape once they returned to the station and thawed out. This tragic event needed a team effort from the Fire Department, Police Department and Public Works Department.

The City received word that we will receive \$13,000 for the airport from the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act to address Covid-19 public health emergency. The FAA will distribute these grants under the new Airport Coronavirus Response Grant Program. These grant dollars are related to operations, personnel, cleaning, sanitation, janitorial services, combating the spread of pathogens at the airport and debt service.

The Library had a valve fail on the sprinkler system last week which caused flooding in the east end of the main library. Staff is working with insurance to evaluate next steps.

This is my last week with the City of Abilene. Thank you for allowing me to lead the City of Abilene as your City Manager these past two years. AGENDA ITEM HEADING:

Amending Sections 5-410 and 5-411 of current City code pertaining to Heavy Trucks.

BACKGROUND:

Construction of the new portion of Northwest Eighth Street has created the need to amend the current City code pertaining to truck routes. Staff has also recognized that verbiage contained within the current code relating to truck weights creates difficulties for enforcement.

Attached are copies of the current City code along with copies of the proposed amended code.

FISCAL NOTE:

Fiscal impact of amendments would be nominal and associated with the purchase of additional signage.

COMMISSION ACTION:

Approval of amendments to Sections 5-410 and 5-411 of current City code pertaining to Heavy Trucks.

5-410. Heavy Trucks

No person shall operate a truck-trailer or semitrailer with a registered gross vehicle weight in excess of 30,000 pounds on any public street within the corporate limits of the City of Abilene, except on the following designated truck routes:

- (a) First Street from east city limits to Elm Street;
- (b) Buckeye Avenue from north to south city limits;
- (c) Fourteenth Street from the east city limits to Fair Road, to include only those portions inside city limits;
- (d) North Washington Street from Eighth Street to Fourteenth Street, to include only those portions inside the city limits;
- (e) North Van Buren Street and South Van Buren Street;
- (f) Northwest Eighth Street from Vine Street to west city limits;
- (g) Northwest Seventh Street;
- (h) Northeast Twenty-First Street;
- (i) North Brady Street from First Street to Twenty-First Street.

Appropriate signs shall be posted to identify the truck routes established above; however, the absence of such signs shall not act as a defense to a violation of this section.

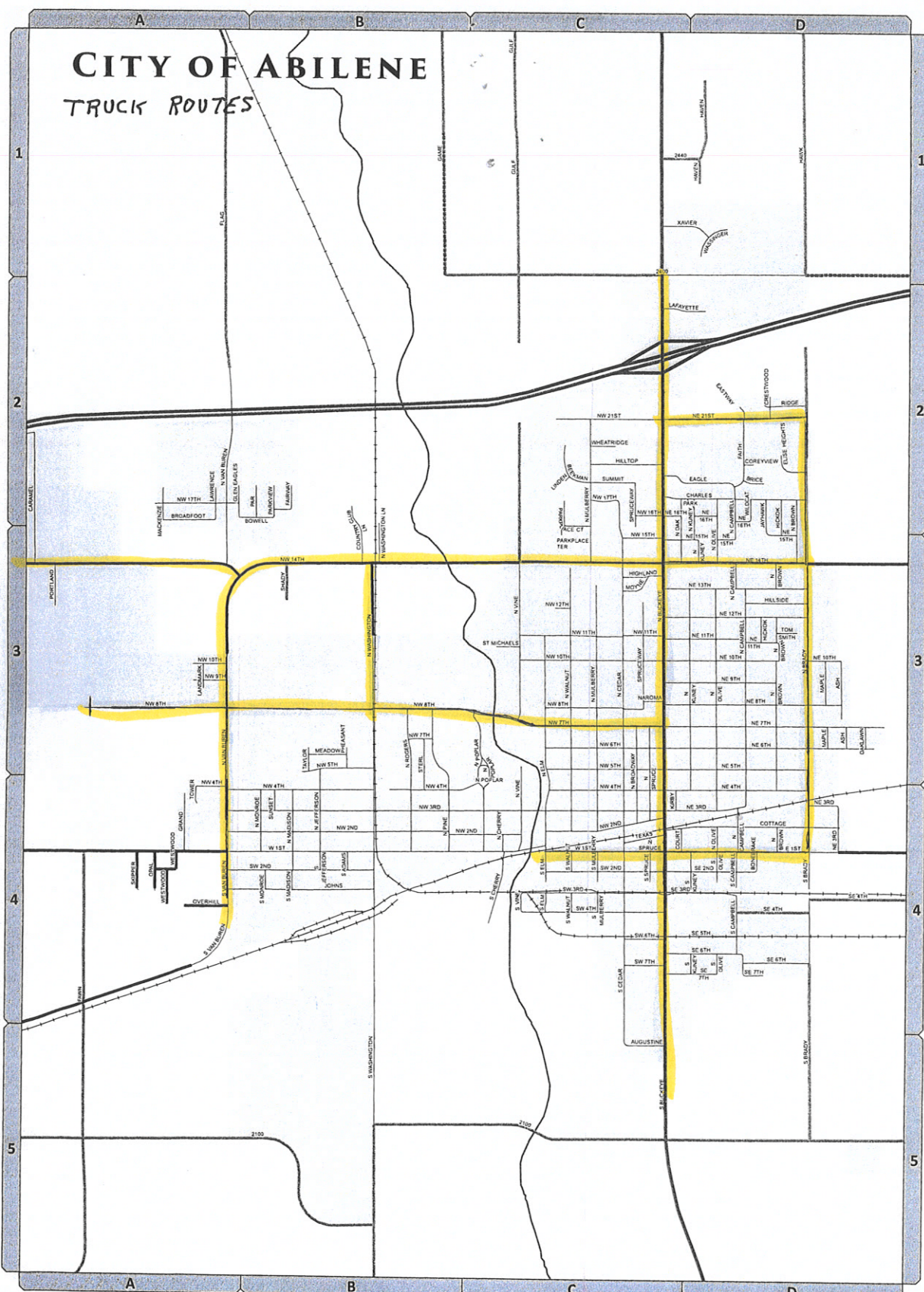
5-411. Same; exceptions.

The provisions of Section 5-410 shall not apply to:

- (a) Emergency vehicles, including ambulances and fire trucks;
- (b) Street, sewer, water, gas, electric and other utility, repair and maintenance vehicles;
- (c) Vehicles used for the purpose of trash and refuse collecting;
- (d) Vehicles en route to parking on privately-owned property.
- (e) It shall not be a violation of this section for a person to operate a truck-trailer or semitrailer upon such streets as are required to reach a destination located off a truck route if such is necessary to accomplish the business of, or purpose related to the truck-trailer or semitrailer. Trucks deviating from the truck routes for such business or purpose shall use the most direct route between the nearest truck route and the destination.

ORDINANCE NO 21-3397

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ARTICLE 4 OF CHAPTER 5 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE. Section 5-410 of the City Code of the City of Abilene is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-410. Heavy Trucks.

No person shall operate a truck-trailer or semitrailer with a registered gross vehicle weight in excess of 30,000 pounds on any public street within the corporate limits of the City of Abilene, except on the following designated truck routes:

- (a) First Street from East City limits to Elm Street;
- (b) Buckeye Avenue from North to South City limits;
- (c) Fourteenth Street from the East City limits to Fair Road, to include only those portions inside City limits;
- (d) North Washington Street from Eighth Street to Fourteenth Street, to include only those portions inside the City limits;
- (e) North Van Buren Street and South Van Buren Street;
- (f) Northwest Eighth Street from Vine Street to West City limits;
- (g) Northwest Seventh Street;
- (h) Northeast Twenty-First Street; and
- (i) North Brady Street from First Street to Twenty-First Street.

SECTION TWO. Section 5-411 of the City Code of the City of Abilene is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-411. Same; exceptions.

The provisions of Section 5-410 shall not apply to:

- (a) Emergency vehicles, including ambulances and fire trucks;
- (b) Street, sewer, water gas, electric and other utility, repair and maintenance vehicles;
- (c) Vehicles used for the purpose of trash and refuse collecting;
- (d) Vehicles en route to parking on privately-owned property; and
- (e) Truck-trailers and semitrailers operated upon such streets as are required to reach a destination located off a truck route if necessary to accomplish the business of, or purpose related to, the truck-trailer or semitrailer. Trucks deviating from the truck routes for such business or purpose shall use the most direct route between the nearest truck route and the destination.

SECTION THREE. Existing Sections 5-410 and 5-411 are hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its adoption and publication once in the official City newspaper by the following summary:

Ordinance No 21-3397

On March 8, 2021, the City Commission passed Ordinance No. 21-3397. The Ordinance amends Chapter 5, Sections 5-410 and 5-411 of the Code to the City of Abilene, Kansas pertaining to heavy trucks within the City of Abilene, Kansas. The Ordinance will be in full force after the publication of this summary Ordinance once in the official City newspaper.
