Consider approval to install new flooring in the Abilene Senior Center for the amount of \$28,200.86

BACKGROUND:

The Abilene Senior Center is in need of new flooring. The existing flooring has cracks and holes in the concrete that is in need of repair. The existing floor would be torn out and replaced with new VCT tiles. New carpet will replace the floors in the lounge area and pool room. The new tile in the Senior Center will require a coat of wax once installed. This will be done by another vendor. Floors will need to be waxed once a year for maximum upkeep.

Staff is recommending Geske Interiors for this project.

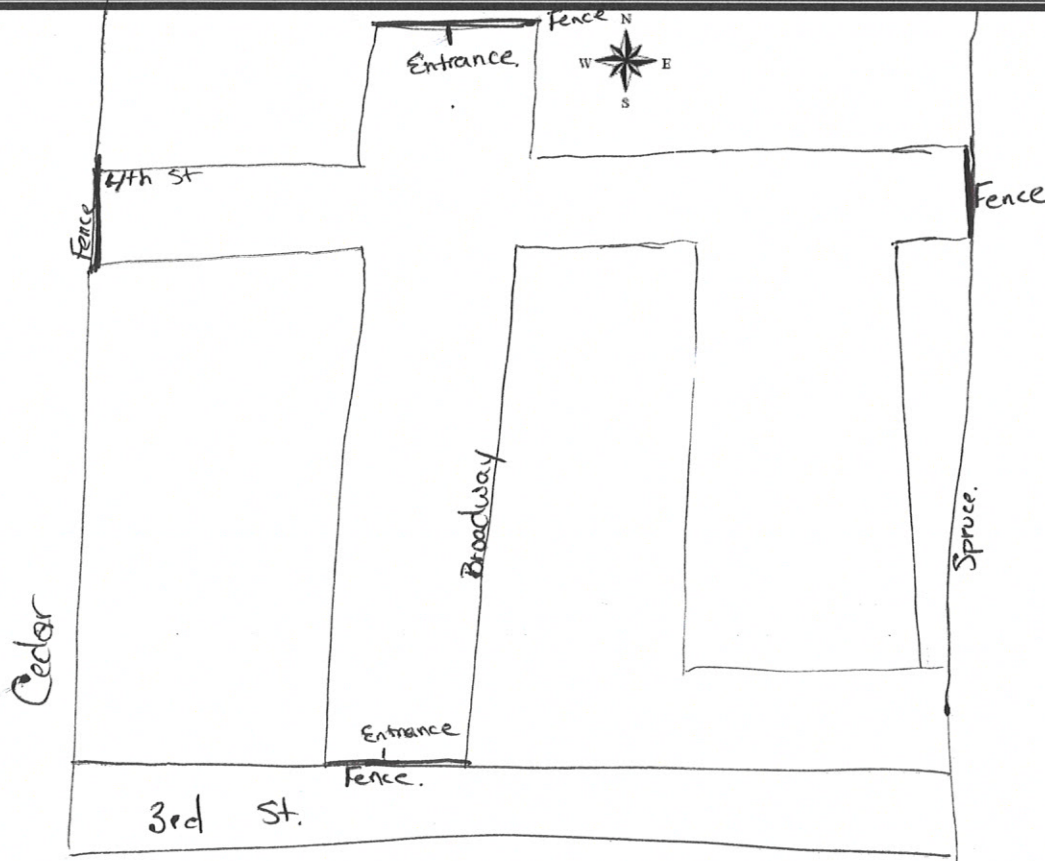

ORDINANCE NO. 22-3421

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE SALE, CONSUMPTION AND POSSESSION OF ALCOHOLIC LIQUOR AT A SPECIFIED LOCATION ON THE PUBLIC RIGHT-OF-WAY AND APPROVING THE CLOSURE OF PUBLIC PROPERTY FOR THE ABILENE OKTOBERFEST.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS:

Section 1. Authorization is given to barricade a portion of Broadway Avenue between NW Third Street and NW Fourth Street, portions of NW Fourth Street, Little Ike Park and the City parking lot adjoining Little Ike Park and NW Fourth Street between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:59 p.m. on September 16, between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on September 17, 2022, and between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m. on September 18, 2022, for the Abilene Oktoberfest Event (the "Event").

Section 2. The barricaded portion of Broadway Ave., NW Fourth Street, Little Ike Park and City parking lot as set forth above shall be temporarily closed between the hours of 5:00 p.m. and 11:59 p.m. on September 16, between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on September 17, 2022, and between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 1:00 a.m. on September 18, 2022. Vendors holding the appropriate license from the State of Kansas to sell alcoholic liquor may in accordance with all applicable state laws and municipal ordinances sell alcoholic liquor in the specific area to be barricaded identified above and as approved and designated by the Division of Alcohol Beverage Control. The Abilene Oktoberfest, LLC shall provide security for the Event and conduct the Event in accordance with its plan submitted with the application, a copy of which plan is available for review at the City Office, 419 N. Broadway, Abilene, Kansas. It shall be the duty of the Event organizer and the vendor(s) to restrict access to alcoholic beverages to those persons twenty-one (21) or older.

Section 3. Event attendees twenty-one (21) and older may buy, possess, and consume alcoholic beverages in the specified area and during the times designated above.

Section 4. The Event is hereby approved by the Governing Body as a special event as required by K.S.A. 41-719(a)(2).

Section 5. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication once in the official city newspaper by the following summary:

Ordinance No. 22-3421 Summary

On August 22, 2022, the City Commission passed Ordinance No. 22-3421. The ordinance authorizes the sale, consumption, and possession of alcoholic liquor at a specified location on the public right-of-way and approves the closure of public property for the Abilene Oktoberfest, LLC. BACKGROUND:

Annually, after the legislative session passing law into effect the League of Municipalities publishes the Standard Traffic Ordinance (STO) and Uniform Public Offense Code (UPOC). This year that legislative session occurred on July 1, 2022. Both books are designed to provide a comprehensive traffic code and public offense ordinance for Kansas cities. Changes do not take effect in a municipality until the governing body passes and publishes an ordinance incorporating it by reference.

ORDINANCE NO. 22-3419

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5, SECTION 5-401 OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS, BY ADOPTING AND INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE *STANDARD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE FOR KANSAS CITIES*, 49th EDITION (2022); AND REPEALING EXISTING SECTION 5-401.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE. Section 5-401 of the City Code of the City of Abilene, Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-401. Incorporating Standard Traffic Ordinance. The *Standard Traffic Ordinance for Kansas Cities*, 49th Edition (2022), published by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas (the “Standard Traffic Ordinance”), is adopted and incorporated by reference except such portions as are hereinafter amended. At least one copy of the Standard Traffic Ordinance shall be marked or stamped “Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 22-3419” with all sections thereof intended to be amended clearly marked to show any such amendments and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable business hours.

SECTION TWO. Existing Section 5-401 is hereby repealed.

SECTION THREE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication once in the official city newspaper by the following summary:

ORDINANCE NO. 22-3420

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 5, SECTION 5-101 OF THE CITY CODE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS, BY ADOPTING AND INCORPORATING BY REFERENCE THE *UNIFORM PUBLIC OFFENSE CODE FOR KANSAS CITIES*, 38th EDITION (2022), WITH CERTAIN OMISSIONS AND AMENDMENTS THERETO; AND REPEALING EXISTING SECTION 5-101.

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE. Section 5-101 of the City Code of the City of Abilene, Kansas is hereby amended to read as follows:

5-101. Incorporating Uniform Public Offense Code with amendments.

- (a) **Incorporation by reference.** The *Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities*, 38th Edition (2022), published by the League of Kansas Municipalities, Topeka, Kansas (the “Uniform Public Offense Code”), is adopted and incorporated by reference except such sections as are hereinafter omitted or amended as set forth in paragraphs (b) and (c) below. At least one copy of the Uniform Public Offense Code shall be marked or stamped “Official Copy as Adopted by Ordinance No. 22-3420” with all sections thereof intended to be omitted or amended clearly marked to show any such omission or amendment and to which shall be attached a copy of this ordinance, and filed with the City Clerk to be open to inspection and available to the public at all reasonable business hours.
- (b) **Omissions.** Sections 6.16, 6.19, and 10.29 of the Uniform Public Offense Code are hereby omitted.
- (c) **Amendment.** The definition of “Smoking” in section (o) of the “Smoking; Definitions” paragraph of Section 1.1 of the Uniform Public Offense Code is hereby amended to read as follows:
 - (o) Smoking means possession of a lighted cigarette, cigar, pipe or burning tobacco in any other form or device designed for the use of tobacco, or possession and use of any electronic cigarette.

SECTION TWO. Existing Section 5-101 is hereby repealed.

SECTION THREE. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption and publication once in the official city newspaper by the following summary:

Ordinance No. 22-3420 Summary

On August 22, 2022, the City Commission passed Ordinance No. 22-3420. The ordinance amends Chapter 5, Section 5-101 of the City Code of the City of Abilene, Kansas, by adopting and incorporating by reference the *Uniform Public Offense Code for Kansas Cities*, 38th Edition (2022) prepared and published in book form by the League of Kansas Municipalities, but omitting Sections 6.16, 6.19, and 10.29 thereof, and amending the definition of “Smoking” in section (o) of the “Smoking; Definitions” paragraph of Section 1.1 to include possession and use of any electronic cigarette. 2022 Changes to the Standard Traffic Ordinance and Uniform Public Offense Code

The Legislature made several changes to statutes affecting the STO and UPOC this session. This article provides a list of those changes.

Changes to the STO

Section 1 Definitions.

The following definitions were amended: All-Terrain Vehicle (SB 101), Electric-Assisted Bicycle (SB 101), Electric-Assisted Scooter (SB 101), Motor Vehicle (SB 101), Motorcycle (SB 101), and Motorized Bicycle (SB 101).

Section 10.1. Funeral Processions and Sec. 119. Parades and Processions.

The Legislature did not make changes to any statutes affecting funeral processions or parades. The League, however, added chief “of police or designee” to these sections to provide more flexibility for reviewing them.

Section 30. Driving Under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor or Drugs; Penalties.

HB 2377, Section 4, amends the penalties for driving under the influence; allows courts to waive any portion of a fine, except for the \$250 required to be remitted to the state treasurer, if the individual completes a court-ordered education or treatment; clarifies that amending or dismissing a charge is permitted if there is not sufficient admissible evidence to support a conviction beyond a reasonable doubt; and modifies the definition for “imprisonment.”

Section 30.1. Driving Commercial Motor Vehicle Under the Influence of Intoxicating Liquor or Drugs; Penalties.

HB 2377, Section 9, amends the penalties for driving a commercial motor vehicle under the influence; allows courts to waive any portion of a fine, except for the \$250 required to be remitted to the state treasurer, if the individual completes a court-ordered education or treatment; clarifies that amending or dismissing a charge is permitted if there is not sufficient admissible evidence to support a conviction beyond a reasonable doubt; and modifies the definition for “imprisonment.”

Section 30.5. Commercial Driver’s Licenses; Diversion Agreements Not Allowed.

HB 2377, Section 10, prohibits prosecuting attorneys from masking, deferring imposition of judgment, or giving an individual a diversion “that would prevent a commercial learner’s permit or commercial driver’s license holder’s conviction from appearing on the CDLIS driver record of a local traffic law that occurred in any type of motor vehicle.” This prohibition does not apply to parking, vehicle weight, or other vehicle defect violations.

Section 126.1.1. Display of License Plate.

Subsection (e) requiring law enforcement officers to issue a warning for certain violations expired on January 1, 2022, and has been deleted.

Section 135. Electric-Assisted Bicycles, Traffic Law Application.

SB 101, Section 9, amends the state statute on electric-assisted bicycles. The amendments clarify electric-assisted bicycles are allowed on streets, highways, etc. The bill provides that individuals do not need a driver’s license or vehicle liability insurance to ride an electric-assisted bicycle. The bill also exempts electric-assisted bicycles from the motor vehicle definition. The League amended the STO to mirror state law but, under K.S.A. 8-1592b(f)(2), a city may adopt an ordinance further restricting and governing the operation of electric-assisted bicycles on streets, highways, roadways, sidewalks, sidewalk areas, bicycle or multi-use paths, or trail or trail networks.



Changes to the UPOC

Section 1.1. Definitions.

The League deleted the definitions for advance voting site, because it is in Sec. 7.14, and maliciously, because that term is not used in the UPOC. The definitions for controlled substance and law enforcement officer were also updated to mirror state law. Other definitions that were amended include: Dwelling (HB 2508), Motor Vehicle (SB 101), Possession (HB 2508), Public Employee (HB 2508), Vehicle Dealer (SB 101), Wildlife (SB 101), and Written Instrument (HB 2508).

Section 3.2.1. Sexual Battery.

The League updated the editor's note in light of *City of Shawnee v. Adem*, 214 Kan 12 (2021). There, the Kansas Supreme Court held the Kansas Offender Registration Act applies to any person convicted of sexual battery under Sec. 3.2.1. of the UPOC.

Section 6.1. Theft.

SB 483, Section 1, amends the theft statute to address the theft of remote service units. The League also amended the editor's note to include changes made by SB 408 and HB 2492.

Section 6.5. Criminal Deprivation of Property.

The League added the motor vehicle definition to this section to match state law.

Section 6.18. Motor Vehicle Dealers; Selling Motor Vehicles Without a License.

SB 101, Section 10, amends the definitions of vehicle and motor vehicle, exempting electric-assisted bicycles from those definitions.

Section 7.5. Distribution of Unattributed Applications for Advance Voting Ballots.

The League deleted this provision from the UPOC in light of *VoteAmerica v. Schwab*, 2021 WL 5918918 (D. Kan. 2021).

Section 7.14. Electioneering.

HB 2138, Section 7, clarifies that the electioneering offense does not apply to certain individuals, such as certain county election office employees while they are performing their duties as employees.

Section 7.15. Intimidation of a Witness or Victim.

The League added the definition civil injury or loss to match state law.

Section 9.9.5. Unlawful Possession of a Simulated Substance.

The League added the definition of simulated controlled substance to this section.

Section 10.30. Operating an Aircraft Under the Influence, Section 10.30.1 Same; Preliminary Breath Test, and Section 10.30.2. Same; Definitions.

HB 2377, Sections 1-4 added a new offense for operating an aircraft under the influence. The League added this offense to Sections 10.30–10.30.2.

Section 11.8. Gambling.

SB 84, Section 20, excludes sports wagering from the definition of bet.

In addition, to the changes described above, the League updated several citations to state law and changed “his or her” and “her or she” to “their” or “they” to be more inclusive. 🌟
